

# Instructions on how to check Sec 3 subject allocation & form class

The Sec 3 form class and subject allocation results will be released on 12 Nov (Wed) at 9am.

If you wish to appeal, appeals must be submitted by 14 Nov (Fri) at 12 noon.



# The username will be your email address ending in @students.edu.sg The password will be your usual password for this email address. This is the same login details used for your subject selection. ### Frequently asked questions

### 1. When can I check my subject selection results?

The form class and subject selection results will be released on 12 Nov (Wed) at 9am. The system is programmed to release this form at 9am, so you will not see this form if you log in before 9am.

### 2. I don't see the form even after logging in. What should I do?

Scroll all the way down as the form could be at the bottom of the list. The form should be entitled "Subject Selection Results (<Sec 3 class name> 2026)).

If you still don't see it, contact your form teachers.

## 3. Can I appeal for a subject combination (e.g. Pure Science) if I did not meet the qualifying criteria for the subjects?

No. We seek your understanding that the subject criteria has been put in place to ensure that you can cope with the rigour of the subjects offered. The criteria are also held in fairness to all students in the cohort.

<u>All</u> students who have been admitted to E1 (Pure Science), E2 (AM), E3 (POA), E4D (MUSIC) & F4 (MUSIC) combinations have met the subject-specific requirements for the combination.

### 4. I chose subject A but was allocated to a different subject. Why?

The allocation of subjects is done based on merit (results) for the specific subject(s). This is held in fairness to all students in the cohort.

Should a particular subject have more applicants than vacancies, students will be ranked in order of their results for that subject. Hence, students may be out-competed and not allocated the subject.

### 5. Will my appeal be successful?

All appeals will be assessed by the respective Heads of Department for the subjects. We seek your kind understanding that there is no guarantee of success for the appeals, as appeals will be assessed on the basis of merit (results), the availability of vacancies for the subject and the demand for the subject among the cohort.
